#### Math

This week we began working on addition strategies with sums larger than 10. We learned about how to count on when we're using smaller addends and talked about how we can use a number line as a tool.

#### Phonics

This week we learned that when the letters f, l, s, or z follow a short vowel, we have to *double* those consonants for the final sound. We used the sentence "Jeff will pass Buzz" to help us remember.

#### Religion

This week our focus was on the Annunciation. We studied the painting some more and talked about the angel Gabriel as a messenger. We learned about what a prophet is and played the game of telephone to help us better understand the role that a prophet plays in sharing a message. The students also practiced saying the Hail Mary prayer.
