Math

This week we continued to work on addition strategies. We emphasized our doubles facts and learned a new song. Ask your child to sing the doubles song for you. ©

Phonics

This week we learned that when a double I comes after the vowels a, o, or u, the vowel sounds change. We also learned that c and k come together at the end of a short vowel word.

Religion

This week we focused on the characteristics of Jesus, diving into the mystery of Jesus being 100% God and 100% human. We also learned the four reasons Jesus came: to save us from sin, so we could know God's love, to show us how to be holy, and to give us a share in God's divine life.

We're also learning the Hail Mary prayer as we celebrate the month of the Rosary.
